During a recent tournament, this sit-uation came up in the first game of a quarter-final nine-point match. White has possession of the doubling cube at

To appreciate this position, black's previous roll was a 6-4 with absolutely no choice but to leave a double shot. White, before rolling, decided to redouble black, moving the cube to 8. If you were white, would you have redoubled the cube? Should black acceptor deciline the double?

With the potential of the six-point prime staring at him, black could be in serious trouble if white hits him. If

black fails to re-enter from the bar on the next roll, white should pick up the second checker and secure a gammon — ending the nine-point match with

— ending the nine-point match with one game.

Black should think his lucky stars drop the cube, take the four-point loss and start the next game.

In the game, however, black accepted the cube. White hit Black stayed on the bar. White hit the second open checker and soon gammoned black, winning the nine-point match, 16-0.

What went wrong?

The first error belongs to whit. for turning the doubling cube from 4 to 8. by offering the cube, white was giving black an opportunity to decline the

cube, which would have given white only four points. White should not have doubled the cube.

Since white was a definite favorite to hit black, white would have done best to hang onto the cube and play for a gammon. Naturally, black made an error in accepting the double.
