## Dinner benefits nun's cancer research

Noted cancer-research scientist Sister Arline Schmeer will head a list of luminaries who will attend a benefit dinner dance on Friday, Dec. 5 at the Detroit Athletic Club.

The gala fund-raiser, which will benefit Sister Arline's cancer research at the AMC Cancer Research Center and Hospital, Denver, Col., will also feature television personality Vic Caputo as master of ceremonies.

Dr. Sonya Friedman, psychologist and WXYZ radio host, will be the guest speaker.

Sister Arline will speak briefly about mercenene, the non-toxic anti-cancer agent she has discovered in clams. She is seeking funds to test mercenene on dogs with spontaneous cancers.

Two special awards will be presented to honorees who, through dedication in volunteer fund-raising efforts, have evidenced their spirit of caring for others less fortunate.

General Motors Corp. Chairman Thomas A. Murphy and his wife will receive the Dolores Lampe Award for their involvement in philanthropic and

civic causes. Rosemary Bannon of Detroit will be the recipient of the Matt Menley Award for her volunteer efforts on behalf of youth and her community.

The awards were established recently in memory of two courageous cancer victims who lived in Birmingham.

Dolores Lampe, who died of cancer in October 1978, was one of the founders of the Michigan Division of the National Fund for Sister Arline's Cancer Research and was the president of the organization from 1977-78. Matt

Monley, a graduate of Brother Rice High School, died of Hodgkin's disease in January 1979 at the age of 21. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Monley, strong supporters of Sister Arline's cancer-research program, now in its 18th year.

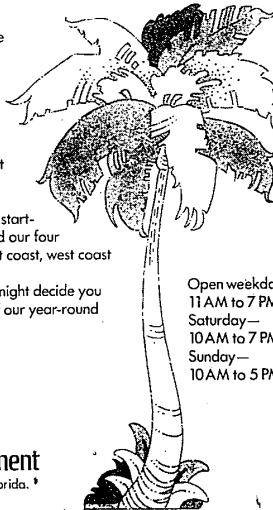
