Featuring the dancing, fights and falls which have made Broadway plays and Hollywood movies so popular, Movin' Theatre will run the gamut from intimate andights of Erroll Flynn to the fast-paced disco of John Travolta in this non-stop show.

The performance surveys the various styles of movement and theatrical dances used in stage productions from medieval times through the present.

## Preview opens production

Wayne State University President Thomas N. Bonner entertained the Hiberry Theatre's 1980-81 Sponsor at the President's Preview performance of "Boy Meets Girl" on Saturday at the Hiberry in Detroit.

The performance was preceded by a subscription dinner at McGregor Memorial Conference Center, which was the setting for "Act IV," the reception following the play for all guests and the Hiberry's graduate repertory company.

The event also was the celebration of another record-breaking year for fund raising by the Understudies' Hiberry, a group of 100 volunteers in Detroit area women who have assumed the task of finding sponsors to contribute to the support of the graduate students that make up the Hiberry company.

According to Mrs. Irving Dworkin, Understudies president, more than \$70,000 has been raised, mostly through individual contributions of \$125 or more. This is \$10,000 more than the amount raised last season and approximately \$15,000 more than that raised in 1978.

MRS. DWORKIN also called attention to the hundreds of Understudies who have helped the Theater for the last 17 years, and the five past presidents, whose photos now hang in the Hiberry's foyer, with a list of the Understudies who served under them.

The President's Preview annually culminates the Understudies' fund raising drive for the support of the repertory company, this year composed of members from 20 states and the Dominion of Canada.

The group includes 23 actors and actresses, 17 technicians and six administrative assistants, who come for ad-

vanced training and intensive performance experience in preparation for professional careers.

Understudies members are currently found working on Broadway, off-Broadway, in regional resident theater, in films and television. Others are on

the faculties of some of the nation's leading universities.

The preview's featured performance, "Boy Meets Girl," is a comedy by Bella and Samuel Spewack and will continue in the 1980-81 repertory through February.




