

# Area honors 8 boy runners

Smith won the MSAA meet for the second consecutive year, was second in the Royal Oak Kimball Regional and was fourth in the Oakland County meet after losing his shoe.

**TIM CANNON — CRANBROOK**

Despite a poor performance at the Class B state meet this season, Cannon, a senior, was everyone's pick on this all-star squad.

A respected runner, Cannon won the Class B regional at Oxford and the Metro Conference league meet.

Cannon is a two-time winner of the prestigious Oakland County meet and a winner at the Royal Oak Shrine Invitational.

The Crane harrier finished second in the Class B state meet as a junior.

**MARK SHAW — WEST BLOOMFIELD**

Shaw, a senior, was the Greater Oakland Activities League champion, winning the league meet at Marshbank with a time of 15:23 for three miles.

Shaw was fourth in his regional at Grand Blanc with a time of 16:37 for 5,000 meters. He was sixth in the county meet (16:28) and 22nd in the Class A state meet (16:06).

**DAVID KRAFSUR — SOUTHFIELD-LATHRUP**

There weren't too many runners in the MSAA this year with the ability to beat Lathrup's Krafur. He won almost all of his dual meets, losing only to Groves' Smith.

Krafur finished third in the MSAA meet with a time of 16:01. He was sixth in the Kimball regional (15:41) and 13th in the county meet (16:43).

Krafur finished 11th in the Class A state meet with a time of 15:51.

**PETE STOUFFER — AVONDALE**

A senior, Stouffer paced the Yellowjackets all year long.

He was third in the Shrine Invitational, fifth in the Holly Invitational and fifth in the Class B regional at Linds.

Stouffer finished 10th in the Class B state meet. He finished 18th in the 17-18-year-old age group of the Athletic Congress/Amateur Athletic Union Junior Olympic cross country championships with a time of 16:46.5 for 5,000 meters.

**CHRIS DORCEY — BROTHER RICE**

A junior, Dorcey saved his best performance of the year for last, finishing eighth in the Class A state meet to pace the Warriors' balanced attack.

Dorcey was seventh in the Kimball Regional, ninth in the Catholic League meet at Marshbank, and 14th in the county meet.

**TIM SULLIVAN — BROTHER RICE**

Another repeat selection from last year's team, Sullivan was a big part of Rice's very successful season. The senior led the Warriors to first in the Catholic League A-B Division, the Oakland County meet, the West Bloomfield Invitational and the Kimball Regional.

Sullivan finished first in the Kimball Regional, nosing out Groves' Smith. He was third in the league meet and the county meet, and finished 19th in the Class A state meet.

**JOE DAVEY — BROTHER RICE**

Only a sophomore, Davey is already starting to follow in some pretty big footsteps laid down by brother Pat Davey a few years ago.

Pat Davey was a Class A state champion at Brother Rice.

Joe Davey led Rice in this year's Catholic League meet with a first-place finish. He was third in the Kimball Regional, seventh in the county meet, and 16th in the state meet.

**BOB STARK — BROTHER RICE**

Stark did nothing this year to tarnish a record as one of the top cross country coaches in the area. Coming into 1980, Stark had won 56 dual meets and had lost only five since 1969 for a winning percentage of .918.

That's the top percentage among all Brother Rice coaches — including football's Al Fracassa and basketball's Bill Norton.

The 1980 edition of the Rice cross country team was first in the A-B Division of the Catholic League, first in the Kimball Regional, first in the Oakland County meet and first in the West Bloomfield Invitational.

At one point late in the season, the Class A Warriors were ranked as high as No. 2 in the state by the Michigan High School Athletic Association.

They fell from that lofty position in the state meet, however, finishing sixth.

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# Rochester harriers head O&E girls' squad

Franssen ran neck and neck with teammate Landry through most of 1980, finishing second in the GOAL meet, third in the county meet and third in the Kimball Regional.

She pulled ahead, however, in the state meet, finishing fourth with a time of 18:09.7 for 5,000 meters.

Franssen and Landry accounted for a good share of Rochester's third-place finish in the state meet.

**ANNA BAUER — SEAHOLM**

A senior, Bauer finished 11th overall in the Class A state meet with a time of 18:43.5, qualifying her for all-state honors.

Bauer was Seaholm's top runner all year long. She finished second in the Southeastern Michigan Association meet, was fourth in the Kimball Regional and was seventh in the Oakland County meet.

**JOANNE SIMONETTI — SEAHOLM**

Simonetti, another senior, together with Bauer gave Seaholm a potent one-two punch.

Simonetti finished fourth in the SMA meet, 11th in the county meet, and 10th in the Kimball Regional.

She was 17th in the individual race at the state meet with a time of 19:28 for 5,000 meters.

**LISA REIMUND — TROY ATHENS**

Reimund spent the first two thirds of the season sidelined with an injury. But once she got started, Reimund exploded on the local cross country scene.

A relative unknown starting her first year of cross country competition, Reimund racked up many impressive showings.

She was second in both the Bishop Gallagher Invitational and the Metro Suburban Activities Association meet. Reimund was fifth in the Kimball

Regional and seventh in the MSAA-SMA meet.

She finished ninth overall in the Class A state meet to qualify for the all-state squad.

**MINI BAKER — LAHSER**

Baker was one of the few runners to get the better of Athens' Reimund, winning the MSAA meet with a time of 19:34.

Only a sophomore with two more years ahead of her, Baker was seventh in the Oxford Invitational (18:47), sixth in the Kimball Regional (19:39), and ninth in the county meet (20:12).

Baker was 16th overall in the Class A state meet (19:14).

She holds the Lahser three-mile course record of 18:57.

**ALIA NEWMAN — COUNTRY DAY**

Newman, a freshman, had an impressive debut with the Yellow Jackets, finishing fifth in the Class D state meet at Potterville with a time of 20:20 for 5,000 meters.

She won the Metro Conference meet at Cranbrook with a time of 18:52 for three miles.

Newman also was fifth in the C-D Division of the Oakland County meet with a time of 20:25.

Newman holds Country Day records in both the three mile and the 5,000 meters.

**GEORGE LONG — TROY ATHENS**

Long, a graduate of Rochester High School, had one of his best seasons ever, coaching the Red Hawks to a league championship in the MSAA and a ninth-place finish in the Class A state meet.

Long coaches both the Athens girls' team and the Athens' boys team.

Long started coaching in 1967 at Troy High School, then moved to Athens when it opened in 1974. Long had a league champion boys' team while at Troy in the old Oakland Athletic League.

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
