## Oakland eyes student tuition hike

Getting admitted as an Oakland University student will be more difficult next year. And those students who will next year. And those students who will attend the school will find the tuition

The Avon Township college has capped enrollment at its present level and is considering a tuition hike for

January.

According to the university's budget director, Ray Harris, Oakland is the first college in the state to cap its en-rollment. Both measures follow Gov. William Milliken's Nov. 12 announcement that

Both measures follow Gov. William Milliken's Nov. 12 announcement that he state's 1980-81 budget will reduce appropriations to colleges and universities by \$60 million.

The cut slated for Oakland is \$910,000.

The university has capped its enrollment at \$,700 fiscal-year-equated students for 1981-82, the same number 1981-82, the same number of 1981-82. (The university computes its fiscal-year-equated stunden enrollment by dividing the total number of credits it delivers in a fiscal year by 31. The university's actual enrollment is approximately 12,000. Not all of its students take 31 credits in a fiscal year.) By apping enrollment, OU Budget Director Ray Harris estimates the university will save \$100,000 in salaries for faculty members.

THE UNIVERSITY, by contract, must hire five full-time equivalent teachers for each 100 additional fiscal-year-equivalent students it enrolls.

Harris said admission officials haven't decided yet how they will restrict enrollment.

One university official said the university has a number of options, including tightening admission requirements for grade-point averages and test scores.

The school might also eliminate some of its extension courses in neighboring communities, he said.

Harris said the university is considering a January tuition increase of 50 cents to \$1.50 per credit. Such an increase would yield approximately \$150,000.

It last increased tuition in the spring. The university has taken other measures to recoup the \$910,000 state-aid cut. Those include leaving the new O'Dowd Hall empty until September 1981.
