Senior tri-captain Steve Alen has caught 25 passes and three touchdowns.
Running back Mike Neff enters the game with 878 yards in 181 carries.

TIM MacLEAN, John Maher and Greg Dingens head the Rice defense. MacLean, a senior tri-captain, leads the Warriors with 11 tackles. Maher, the other linebacker, has 101 tackles, while Dingens, only a junior, has 77 tackles at his interior-line position.

Rice's defense isn't overpowering, but it has relied on ex-ceptional quickness to thwart this year's opposition.

That defense will be tested against Fordson's one-two running attack of Mike McGowan and Tom Matelic. It may be the strongest running combination in the state.

They are a powerful team, "Fracasas said of Fordson.
