Senior Cannon came home with a third place, 16:20 clocking among 150 runners in the 17-18-year-old age division.

Moore placed 47th in the 15-16 division.

Cannon and Brewster Moore competed in the Michigan finals and their team, the Motor City Track Club, qualified for the regional.

Cannon was undefeated in Cranbrook team competition this past season. He was the state Class B champion in the mile and runner-up in the two-mile last year.

Cannon advances to the National AAU Championship in December in Kansas.
