Suburbanites join forces for Thanksgiving parade

The Hudson's Thanksgiving parade tomorrow will have a distinct suburban touch to it.

There will be high school marching bands from Troy and Garden City, a community band from Frankin Village and unicyclists from Redford Township.

ful.

Besides the several hundred thousand expected to line the lower end of Woodward Avenue in Detroit to watch the parade, millions more will view it from the comfort of their living room TV set.

The parade begins at 9:30 a.m. from Woodward and Putnam with the TV crews going live at 10 a.m.

The local persons working on the parade will be part of a 53-year tradition which manages to combine something old with something new.

Thursday's parade will have Noah's Ark, which reflects the "Good Ship Lollipop" theme picked in a float design contest.

They include a float from the popu-lar Star Wars film "The Empire Strikes Back," the Good Ship Lollipop, Noah's Ark, King Neptune's World, St. Paul Ice Castle, Fish Fantasy and Har-monie Show Boat.

TO PROVIDE the musical sounds for the parade will be three suburban bands, including the Franklin Village group which has performed in the past 12 parades. The group will follow the Santa Claus float at the end of the parade.

Others will be the Garden City East High School Panther marching band, directed by James Chene, and the Troy Athens Red Hawk band, led by Fred Junod. Both bands will be in the early section of the parade.

It takes a lot of work to make a ma-jor parade successful. Many Hudson's employees spend three to 12 months before Thanksgiving to make sure ev-erything is in place.

Among those are Troy's Art Wright, director of special events; Dennis Sibthorpe, events studio manager, and Garden City's Henry Kane, who works on the special floats.

He heads a crew of seven which works year-round preparing for the parade.

Sibthorpe said, "It's nerve-racking when it's busy, but it's even more nerve-racking when it's put:"
