Pioneer cagers win 2nd contest

Oakland University men's basketball coach Lee Frederick thought his team would have a "laugh" against the University of Michigan-Dearborn in the Pioneers' home opener earlier this week.

Unfortunately, the laugh was almost on Frederick as his team struggled in the first half before scoring 68 second-half points to post a 111-88 victory over the Wolves.

Forward Rich Braur paced the Pioneers with 26 points and 17 rebounds. The 6-foot-5 senior hit nine of 13 from the field and eight of nine from the free-throw line in addition to grabbing a game-high 17 rebounds. Braur also had three assists and three steals.

Junior forward Bill Peterson from Livonia Clarenceville continued his fine marksmanship hitting six of eight floor shots and five of eight free throws

for 17 points. Peterson is shooting 69.6 percent from the field this season after three games.

Freshman center Mike Mohn added 16 points, and senior guard Les Thomas had 12.

Frederick used his bench very effectively throughout the game, using all 11 players for the third consecutive game. Frederick received 32 points from his reserves, including nine from freshman Larry Lobitz and eight apiece from Anthony Barnard, Dennis Hammond and Rob Manilla, a freshman from Birmingham Brother Rice.

The Wolves (1-3 overall) were paced by John Zanis' 32 points.

Oakland (2-1) will travel to the University of Northern Kentucky for a 7:30 p.m. game Saturday. Oakland opened the season with a victory over the University of Western Ontario. The Pioneers lost to Northern Michigan.
