A Farmington resident, Ms. Kaplan credits her experience at the Southfield Artist's Co-op with shaping her into a professional artist.
"Without the co-op, I just wouldn't be where I am now," she contends.

Ms. Kaplan, whose first one woman show opens at 7 p.m. Wednesday at the Print Gallery is a watercolorist and ceramacist. The show will present both her clay and paintings and will be ex-hibited through the end of December.

"There's no problem being arty as a student, but the question is always:

"Can I do it fullime?" she says.

Encouraged by Ralph Valanta and Ralph Richards of the Southfield Department of Parks and Recreation, Ms. Kaplan joined the co-op when it was in formation.

"I paid \$50 and this bought me the space I needed for a year. After I joined, someone donated a kiln and a wheel and I could do my clay as well as paint." she says.

"I lived at home (then in Southfield) and worked at the co-op. I even got a CETA grant for about four months and was paid for work I did there."


