

# Blood drive established for Cairns

The City of Farmington Hills will sponsor a blood drive on Monday, Dec. 22, in honor of City Clerk Floyd Cairns who recently underwent open heart surgery.

Cairns, 66, was released Friday from the Cleveland Clinic after a successful coronary bypass operation Nov. 26 — his second in 11 years.

He is reported to be resting comfortably.

"We hope many of our employees, council, boards and commission members would like to honor Floyd in this way," said Lawrence Savage, city manager.

"Farmington Hills is included in a five county community blood bank and

because of this, Floyd was covered for his needs for any blood he required.

"Although we're not required to replace Floyd's blood directly, this drive is a way to replenish the blood bank."

Added Barbara Balmforth, assistant to Savage: "The drive is also something the entire community will benefit from."

Community coverage is based on the idea that blood should be available to all who need it, regardless of their membership in a plan or past donor history.

The Red Cross' ability to meet the daily need for between 950 and 1,000 pints of blood now relies almost exclusively on the community. The

southeastern Michigan community includes residents of Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw and St. Clair counties.

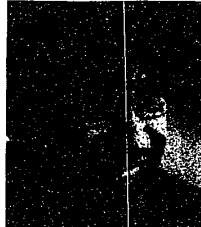
THE DRIVE is also open to the community. Savage hopes at least 80 donors participate.

Cairns, whose lengthy community service spans a quarter of a century, is sometimes called "Mr. Farmington Hills."

A native of old Farmington Township, he was named Citizen of the Year by the Farmington Chamber of Commerce last year.

Besides serving as city clerk, Cairns has served on several voluntary boards, including the Farmington YMCA's board of directors.

He is secretary to the building authority, a member of the Economic Development Corporation, the city's liaison with the Farmington Founders Festival and a member of the Oakland County Elections Commission.

(poor women) have the same right as others do. They still get welfare and Medicaid. It's a matter of priorities," adding, "I don't think poor women really want abortions anyway."

State Rep. John Bennett, D-Redford, voted for the bill and will vote to override, he said.

"We're in a budget crunch," is how he explained his vote. "I don't think we should be spending tax dollars for abortion at this time."

"It's also a moral issue with me. I don't think the state should pay for abortions."

McNamee views the bill as discrimination against the poor.

"I'M NOT an advocate of abortion, but as long as it exists, I agree that it

should be available to both those who are poor and those who are able to pay.

"Abortion, regardless of laws, will always take place, and I want them to take place in sanitary conditions."

"I don't believe in abortion," said State Rep. Roy Smith, R-Ypsilanti, who represents much of the Plymouth area. "That has been my position all along. You can't be on both sides of the issue."

State Rep. Tom Brown, D-Westland, whose district also includes Canton Township and southeastern Plymouth Township, also will vote for an override.

However, he said he would not push for an override and doubts that one will be taken or successful.

Brown said the state's financial problems make the Medicaid cutoff more important than ever.

taken from the Jews and used by the Syrians for their own ceremonies.

Using guerrilla warfare, the Maccabees and their followers retook the temple and ousted the Syrians from their land. The victory was preceded by a series of victories against the Syrians since 168 B.C.

BY THE TIME the Maccabees walked into the temple, Jerusalem — as well as the political and religious autonomy of the Jews — had been regained.

Once they repossessed the temple,

the Maccabees cleansed it and rededicated it.

For the ritual cleansing, they needed purified oil. They could find only one jar of the oil — enough for only one night.

According to legend, the jar miraculously produced enough oil to last eight days.

Today, in Hanukkah celebrations, one candle is lit each night of the eight-day celebration. The candles, used only for this celebration are placed in a Hanukkah menorah sometimes called the hanukiah.
