After running in circles, he set his sister on the floor and sat on her head. Preschoolers frequently find it frus-trating caring for their younger sibl-ings while mom's briefly away, but they can — and will — do it, says an Oakland University psychology profes-

The professor, Robert Stewart of Ro-chester, recently watched with a one-way mirror the actions of 54 pres-choolers while alone with a younger

choolers while alone with a younger Fifty percent of them consoled their rounger by hugging or kissing younger at them on the head, telling them mother would be right back or playing with them.

"That's a large number considering their age," Stewart said.

"What they were doing is interpret-ing cries, role playing and empathizing. These are complex behaviors — even for an adult."

he conducted the study so he could help preschoolers better care for their

preschoolers better care for inear younger siblings.

He said he is considering a workshop in spring. The workshop would teach preschoolers how to care for babies and explain why they sometimes cry and what they can do to help.

STEWART SAID he doesn't want to make preschoolers "active caretakers" of their little brothers and sisters. "I'm not trying to create mother's little helpers. I want them to have the skills to be left with a crying sibling," he said.

While preschoolers aren't capable of caring for babies during extended periods. Stewart said they frequently are left in the same room with them white mom leaves to prepare lunch, put clothes in the dryer or make a bed. Stewart studied the reactions of 54 preschoolers, all about age 4, toward their younger siblings, all about 2½ years younger siblings, all about 2½

The majority of the children were white, from upper-middle-class families. Many came from Rochester, Avon Township, Birmingham and Pontiac.
Two-thirds of the 4-year-olds had at-

tended preschool.

The children's parents were well-ed-ucated. Sixty percent of the fathers, who averaged 32, had bachelor's de-grees. The mothers, who averaged 30, were slightly less educated than their burbands.

The study was conducted in a room resembling a doctor's waiting room. Mothers entered the room with their children then left momentarily under the pretense of visiting the doctor.

STEWART FOUND the 4-year-olds modeled their actions after the parent who is the same sex as them. For every sign their younger siblings gave that they were discontent with their mother's absence, boys gave an average of one form of reassurance, be it and a kits or hug.

average of one form of reassurance, be it a pat, a kiss or hug. For every sign of discontent their younger siblings gave, girls gave an average of five forms of reassurance. In earlier studies, men and women have reacted with the same ratio to their children's needs, Stewart said.

pattern. For every two signs of discontent demonstrated by younger brother, boys reacted with one form of reassurance. But for every single sign of discontent demonstrated by younger sister, boys responded with four forms of reassurance. For every one sign of discontent younger sisters demonstrated, girls reassured them in two ways. But for every single sign of discontent younger brothers showed, girls reassured them 16 times.

Stewart also detected a cross-sex

In addition, Stewart found the children who best responded to their younger siblings distress were those who: had attended preschool, which teaches interaction with others; were instructed by their mothers to "take care" of their younger siblings during the mother's absence, had mothers who demonstrated child-care skills in their


