"I get to the point where I want to get the damn thing over with," said Coughlin, who has written, among other books, "The Day of Wrath." He first tries to capture a story in his imagination, then he begins to put it down on paper, mindless of his typing and spelling, which he admits are poor. "As I'm writing the first graph, I'm telling myself the story."

"It never occured to me until I was giving a lecture that all my books have a legal background: It was always an axiom — write about things you know best," said Coughlin, a Wayne county judge.

By day, he can be found in court. By night, he enjoys a slightly related employment. He kills people — on paper.
