IF VISIONS OF January's rent increase are dancing in your head, you might want to visit Frank's Nursery in Farmington Plaza.

Ceramic candle centerpieces are \$5.79, huge red velvet bows to hang on a door are \$2.99 and electric Christmas lamps are \$4.99.

## Interest rate fought

conventional mortgage for some buyers.

"When the rate comes down, the buyer can refinance the home."

ALL AGREE THE brunt of high interest rates is born by commercial borrowers who need cash for business and residential expansion.

"Quite frankly, the pattern will be to discourage a number of these loans," said James Wibby, president of Metropolitan National Bank of Farmington.

Wibby, who classifies himself as a normally optimistic person, is holding his opinions in check until he sees what the new administration in Washington will do.

"We have some very basic flaws in our economy," Wibby said. "The basic problem is deficit spending by the federal government."

"That really is the cause of inflation. Until Washington actually cuts the budget, we'll have problems."

Wibby predicts the housing market will undergo some drastic changes in the next two years.

"The long-term mortgage market is in disarray. No one wants to loan for more than six months or a year at the moment."

"I think we're going to have to see some different, affordable housing in the next two years."
