Stern appointed business chief

Dr. Myles Stern of Farmington Hills has been appointed chairman of the department of accounting in the school of business administration at Wayne State University.
Accounting is the largest department in WSU's Business School, with more than 750 student majors.
A member of the WSU faculty since 1971, Stern, 35, is an expert in business computing systems, accounting theory and data-base systems. His one-day seminar on "Microcomputers for Business" has been offered in several cities and has been popular with professionals and owners of small businesses.
Stern is the editor of MAS Communication, the Bulletin of the Management Advisory Services Section of the American Accounting Association, and has also written many articles and papers on business computing systems, accounting theory and health-care systems.
He has a Ph.D. from Michigan State University and received the Certificate of Distinguished Performance on the examination for the Certificate in Management Accounting. Only about 10 such awards are given annually nation-

wide to the 500 or so persons who take the test.
