Mark Garrett, a 5-foot-10 junior guard, led Northwest with 18 points on nine baskets. Teammate Dave Austin, a 6-foot-1 senior forward, contributed 17 points, and Tim Farah had 10.

Manogian got 25 points from Stephen Essayan and 20 more from Mike Toorian.

Northwest led by three points (31-28) at halftime and then went up by as many as 11 points during the third quarter.

FRANKLIN 60 — HARRISON 58

Farmington Harrison's basketball team is gaining a reputation as a hard-luck team. The Hawks have a 1-3 record — all the losses by a total of only eight points.

Livonia Franklin last Tuesday nipped Harrison, 60-58, in a non-league game in Livonia. The Hawks raced to a 16-4 lead after the first quarter, but then were outscored 21-6, in the second. Jeff Wojcik led Franklin with 20 points, Ron Lehman added 12, and John Hart had 10.

Steve Vollata, a junior, scored 14

points for Harrison. Goran Vasovski contributed 11 points, and Steve Shamboss had 10 before fouling out.

REDFORD UNION 78 — FARMINGTON HIGH 51

Farmington High's Jerry Liphardt, who scored 29 points in the Falcons' season-opening victory over Livonia Bentley last Tuesday. The win put coach Jack Merritt's Farmington squad at 1-1 this season.

Uzelac won the 50-yard freestyle (2:39) and the 100-yard freestyle (1:07.3). Mark Grover won the 100 freestyle for Farmington in 54.5, and teammate Alec Campbell won the 200 individual medley (2:08.2). Farmington diver Randy Kissinger compiled 131.95 points to win that event.

Farmington swims next on Thursday, Dec. 19, at Dearborn Edsel Ford. The meet has a 7 p.m. start.

In another meet last Tuesday, Livonia Stevenson dunked North Farmington, 39-79. North is 0-2 under first-year coach Jordan Hatch.

North Farmington hosts city-rival Farmington Harrison on Thursday at 7 p.m.

Harrison, coached by Lisa Vautaw, whipped Novi High, 101-62, in a practice meet last Tuesday.

Ted Rudel won the 200 free (1:59.2) and the 500 free (8:19.0) for Harrison. Teammate Steve Goldman won the 200 IM (2:18.1) and the 100 fly (1:00.0). Harrison's Jeff Lukowski won the diving event with 156.50 points.
