

Area's women bowlers show their worth

If ever there was any doubt about the ability of the women bowlers in the Detroit area compared with those from other sections of the country, it disappeared Monday night at Luxury Lanes.

When the firing ceased in the weekly session of the Bowlerettes league, Penny Behn and her Bonanza team had caused a shuffling of the national standings.

On the way to a 3063 series that is fourth high in the nation, the team rolled a single game of 1115 that is in

second place only 30 pins behind the Truway team of Hollywood, Fla. that fired an 1146 early in the season.

Aside from the shuffling caused by Penny and her mates on the Bonanza team, Ruby Williamson of the Bowlerettes is in 10th place in the individual game list with her 299 and in seventh place in the national series standings with 780.

MARGE WUERTH, long a member of the all-star leagues, earned member-

ship in the 700 club this week when she posted a 735 series in the ladies classic at Garden Lanes. She put together games of 279, 233 and 223 for the second highest series rolled here this season.

FOUR NEW male members were admitted to the 700 club in the past few days and two of them are members of the classic at Westland Bowl. The first of these was Randy Pierce with a 740 on games of 256, 226 and 258.

The other honoree was Ken Kossick who opened with 237, added a 232 and closed with 245 for 725.

On the women's side of the classic Cindy Edwards was high with 615.

THREE 700 series came from an unexpected source when Jim Strange, bowling in the senior house league at Woodland Lanes, used a 267 middle game to reach 705 and gain a place among the elite in the area. Tom Bowen missed breaking the 700 barrier by nine pins in the men's trio when he

unloaded a 246 game in a 681 series.

MICKEY O'BRIEN earned a place on the honor roll at Merri Bowl and, like most of his companions who topped the impossible 4-6-7-10 split, he doesn't know how he did it. But it happened in the Merry Makers league and there was a lot of merry making at the finish.

Other good performances at Merri Bowl were recorded by Rod Dulan who had a 638 in the junior house league and June Duck who had a 646 that included a 245 opener in the invitational doubles.

Temple defeated Hammond 48-47 in the championship game. Gilliam stole the ball and made good on a layup with two minutes remaining for the winning points.

Hammond did not score during the last five minutes of the contest.

Gilliam and Martin each netted 12

points in that game, Dunigan 11.

Temple routed Rochester (Mich.) Hills Christian 73-46 in its first game of the tournament.

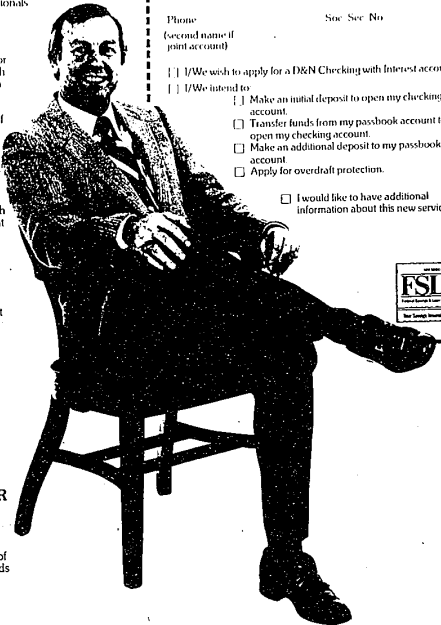
