

Talent marks All-Area cage selections

Kim Booth — Described by coach Dan Hickey as an "excellent shooter," Booth was Adams' leading scorer with 323 points for a stellar 14.0 average. She averaged six rebounds and four assists per game, and was a unanimous Metro Suburban Activities first-team selection. Booth scored a career-high 28 points against Lathrup, including a school-record 14 field goals. "As the year progressed, she began to make progress on defense and becoming a better passer."

Stacy Green — A 6-3 junior center, Green averaged almost as many rebounds (12.7) as she did points (13.5). She had a 57 percent field-goal average, and was an Inter Lakes League first-team selection. Green was the area's top rebounder. "She was a real team player who worked all year to perfect her game," said Farmington coach Bob Leko. Karen Klezek — A 5-9 senior, Klezek scored 247 points in 19 games for a 13.0 average. She averaged almost 10 rebounds per game with 188 total rebounds.

bounds. Coach Myron Campbell said Klezek assisted Groves' turnaround from a 3-15 season last year to 13-6 mark this season.

SECOND TEAM

Sue Flood — Flood has been Marian's leading scorer the past two years. This year the 5-9 forward scored 214 points (12.5 average) and grabbed 162 rebounds (9.5 average). Flood was selected as a first-team player in the Catholic League's Central Division.

Raye Dolven — Rochester's captain and most valuable player, Dolven led her team in nine different categories. The senior forward scored 294 points (14.7 average) and grabbed 134 rebounds — 83 of them off the defensive boards. Her personal high game of the year was a 27-point effort against Seaham.

Judy Severson — Severson scored 162 points and made 63 field goals, but was more important to Athens for her rebounding. A junior forward, Severson had 229 total rebounds (11.6 defensive and 11.3 offensive) to set a new school record. Her best rebounding effort was

23 against Madison.

Jackie Munson — Munson scored 240 points for a 10.4 average. The 5-8 senior forward also had 175 rebounds (7.6 average), and she made 41 percent of her free throws. Munson, who owns a 3.0 grade-point average, had 40 steals. Kathy Landry — A 5-6 junior guard, Landry led the team in assists with three per game. She also averaged 10.3 points, including a personal high of 24 against Harper Woods Regina. Coach Baker called Landry the team's most improved player from 1979 to 1980.

THIRD TEAM

Felicia Hines — Hines scored 276 points (14.5 average) and grabbed 231 rebounds (12.2 average). She had 38 assists and 44 steals. Hines is a junior. Lisa Harding — Harding scored 230 points (12.7) and had a 10.4 rebounding average. She was one of Lathrup's fastest players. Harding is a junior.

Pamela Brooks — Brooks averaged 15 points per game. "In my opinion she is one of the finest guards in the area," said Seaham coach Jeff Parry. Brooks is a junior.

Eileen Steward — Steward scored 188 points (8.2) and grabbed 201 rebounds (8.7). She had 49 steals and a 64 percent average from the free-throw line. Steward is a senior.

Jana Baringer — Baringer scored 199 points (12.4) and had 120 rebounds (7.5). She shot 63 percent from the free-throw line, and had 15 blocked shots.

Baringer is a junior.

COACH OF THE YEAR

John Hansen — Hansen has a sparkling 85-24 (79 percent) overall record in five years of varsity coaching at Lahser. Over the past two seasons, Lahser's teams compiled a 40-6 record.
