The best possible advice for every situation is to leave the shot strategically so as to duplicate the number your opponent would need to hit and/or cover an open blot.



This move also serves another purpose. Should black miss the hit, white then becomes a favorite to cover the 7 point checker on his next roll and will have a safe steppingstone to run his checkers home.


