# 'Meet, Eat & Enjoy' menus highlight 190 restaurants

If each week you visited three or four of the 190 restaurants listed in "The Meet, Eat & Enjoy Menu Book," by the end of the year you would have dined at them all.

Reading the new edition of Mary Conway and Harry Satchwell's large softcover guide (J. Well, Inc., \$8.95) tempts you to strive for this near-impossible dream.

Of course, the authors aren't suggesting you try anything of the sort, but flipping through the book's sample menus from each of the recommended restaurants does make one yearn to spend endless days in an orgy of dining out.

You don't have to be adventuresome, You con't have to be adventuresome, however, or even have lots of money to spend for big dinners to find spots to enjoy, from the book. Many choices are right around home, and some are modestly priced.

OF COURSE, you may want to ven-ture forth to cover even a broader area of restaurant dining. If you love to visit downtown Detroit, there are new places included to supplement old fa-venites.

The new 1981 edition of "Meet, Eat & Enjoy" is 212 pages of recommended places, casual to elegant, American to continental and ethnic, including our Canadian neighbors.

Southeastern Michigan and nearby

Ontario are the geographical areas represented. Ms. Conway and Satchwell claim they dined at more than 100 new spots, as well as more familiar ones, to come up with the 190 they consider totally worth a visit.


