Architects honor local firm at awards banquet

John A. Heslip has been given honorary membership for 1980 in the Detroit chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

The presentation was made by Detroit chapter awards chairman Kenneth Neumann, during a program at the annual honor awards banquet at the Detroit Boat Club on Belle Isle recently.

Heslip, executive director of the Masonry Institute of Michigan, located in Farmington Hills, has sought to establish the institute as a source of information and counsel to architects.

Thanks to his efforts, a course in structural masonry design has been established in the School of Archite-

ture at Lawrence Institute of Technology in Southfield. This was one of the first such courses in the nation.

Since 1973, the Masonry Institute has sponsored a biennial design competition for architectural students at LIT. And for the last four years, the institute has awarded three scholarships annually to LIT architectural students.

The honorary membership in the Detroit chapter is the highest honor a non-architect can receive. The Detroit chapter is a metropolitan chapter of 750 members of the American Institute of Architects, a national professional society of more than 33,000 registered architects.

Nurse joins hospice staff

Denise Whelan, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leo Whelan, live in Farmington Hills, has been appointed a staff nurse at Hospice of Southeastern Michigan in Southfield.

The hospice, which opened in November, cares for persons with limited life expectancy and their families, either at home or in the hospice. It emphasizes human supportive services rather than technology, and is considered an alternative to hospital care for patients with fatal illness.

Miss Whelan is a 1978 graduate of

the Grace Hospital School of Nursing and received her bachelor's degree in nursing from Madonna College in 1980. She served as an intensive care nurse at Harper and Mt. Carmel hospitals prior to joining the hospice.

The hospice was established by a consortium of hospitals which includes Beaumont, Botsford, Children's, Detroit-Osteopathic Hospitals Corp., Henry Ford, Harper-Grace, Michigan Osteopathic Medical Center, Oakwood, Peoples Community Hospital Authority, Providence, St. John and Sinai.

The City of Farmington Hills Planning Commission will give formal consideration to a proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance text, which would amend Article V - RP-1 and RP-2, Planned Residential Districts, in Ordinance No. C-62, the Zoning Ordinance, by amending Section 509 of said Article to provide a new procedure for the review and approval of amendments to Planned Residential District Plans, which amendment would read as follows:

Section 509 - Amendments.

Proposed amendments or changes to an approved PRD plan shall be submitted to the Director of Public Services. The Director shall determine whether the proposed modification is of such minor nature as not to affect the overall character of the plan, and in such event may approve or deny the proposed amendment. If the Director determines the proposed amendment to be substantial in nature, the amendment shall be reviewed in accordance with the provisions and procedures of Section 505.

The proponent in this matter is C.P.W. Investments No. 2, a Michigan partnership. Any person who is interested is invited to participate in the discussion of the proposed zoning text change. Copies of the Zoning Ordinance text, the zoning map, and proposed Ordinance Amendment may be observed at the Farmington Hills City Hall on any business day between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
