ACCORDING TO McGoun's written statement and OCRC records, here is the sequence of events:
On Dec. 8, the last day of bidding, two companies bid on the OCRC's insurance package — workers compensation, fleet, general and auto.
The firm of Huttenlocher, Kerns and Nowell of Waterford bid \$1,017,131. The Troy firm McGoun heads, Fred S. James & Co. of Michigan, bid \$552,896.
Friday, Dec. 19, at 4:30 p.m., two weeks after
