

Y winter classes begin Jan. 12

The Farmington area YMCA is offering classes starting the week of Jan. 12. Registration is Jan. 5, 6:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. for members and 8 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. for non-members. Classes include:

- Adult Ballet Exercise — Beginners and intermediate students will learn all the basic positions and techniques of classical ballet. 6 week class. Wednesday, 8:30-9:30 p.m. Fee is \$14 for members and \$21 for non-members.
- Ballroom Dancing — Learn the Fox Trot, Swing and Cha Cha to the latest steps, movements and styling. Wednesday, 7:30-8:30 p.m. Fee is \$13 for members and \$20 for non-members.
- Baton — Students at any level can get into this class. Wednesday, 6-7 p.m. Fee is \$14 for members and \$20 for non-members.
- Belly Dance and Body Awareness — This program may be used with behavior modification, weight loss and stop smoking regimens. Monday (Beginners) 7-8 p.m., Mondays (advanced beginners) 8-9 p.m. Fee is \$26 for members and \$30 for non-members.
- Brown Bag Youth Theatre — You will learn how to produce and direct your own variety show, which will include acting, dance, choreography, makeup and costume. The class is open to youth 2 years and up. Saturdays, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Fee is \$28 for members and \$36 for non-members.
- Camera Class — This class will be designed to help the individual understand the camera and working materials to achieve desired results in picture taking. Beginning Camera, Monday 8-9:30 p.m.; adult advanced, Wednesday 8-9:30 p.m.; Youth beginning, Saturday 2-3:30 p.m. Fee is \$14 for members and \$21 for non-members.
- Chess Club — Chess club will meet on Thursdays each week and there will be a chance for players of all ages to meet opponents and play games. Thursdays, 7-10 p.m. Fee is \$10 for members.
- Clowning Around — Now you can learn how to be a clown yourself. Bal-

loon tying, makeup, skits, mime, magic and puppets will all be presented and you will get to actually do all of them. Wednesday, 7:30-8:30 p.m. Fee is \$14 for members and \$20 for non-members.

- Creative Stitchery — Needlepoint, embroidery, crewel and covered thread techniques will all be covered. Wednesday, 9:30-10:30 a.m. Fee is \$7 for members and \$11 for non-members.
- Cross Country Ski Lessons — Fee includes one hour of instruction at the Beechwood Touring Center (Beech Road, south of 9 Mile). Students provide their own skis or they can rent skis at the Beechwood Touring Center for under \$5. Several classes will be offered.
- Creative Dance Movement — Balance and rhythm will be taught, help to help increase confidence in

dance patterns. Wednesday, 4-5 p.m. Fee is \$14 for members and \$20 for non-members.

- Dog Obedience — The week obedience course will cover the basic verbal commands. Shot record showing date of distemper, hepatitis and leptospirosis, six foot leather leash, choke collar of proper size and dogs are not to eat after 12 noon on the day of class are required. Thursday, 6-7 p.m. and Thursday 7:15-8:15 p.m. Fee is \$25.
- Floor Hockey — This March we will begin Floor Hockey. Practices will be at local elementary schools, once a week and games are on Saturdays. Watch for a special brochure in early February.
- Flower Arranging and Silk Flower Making — Both dried flower and silk flower arranging will be covered, as well as making silk flowers. Wednesday, 10:30-11:30 a.m. Fee is \$11 for members and \$14 for non-members.
- Guitar Classes — The basic chords and how to use them will be taught in a variety of songs. Our classes are open to a variety of ages and experience. (Minimum youth age is 9 years). Fee is

\$14 for members and \$20 for non-members.
