Potter's training and experience provide an unparalleled resource for class members. As part of Brigham Young University's survival program, Potter spent 30 days in the desert with limited equipment, no pound of rice, and two quarts of water. He escaped burial by avalanche while serving on a mountain rescue team. When gunfire downed his Marine Corps helicopter in Victama, he spent 14 days living off the jungle, coming out of the experience five pounds heavier. Potter presently teaches arctic and desert survival skills to the Army Reserve.



### U-M begins new cancer drug trials

As part of a major expanded program in cancer research at the University of Michigan, promising new cancer drag will be tested in clinical trials at University Hospital.

\*The trials are being funded by the National Cancer institute through a \$1.3 million, five-year grant to the Division of Hemotology/Oncology at the U-M Medical School. The trials will attempt to establish new drug therapy for tumors where previous drug programs have been only marginally effective, and for tumors which have become resistant to standard drugs. The types of disease involved include cancer of the breast, colon, lung, head and neck, and the lymphatic system. cancer of the oreast, coion, iung, nead and neck, and the lymphatic system. "The University of Michigan is one of only four institutions in the country to be selected from 30

that applied for this important research," said Albert F. Lobuglio, M.D., director of hematoloty/oncology, and Wheeler, M.D., and Ron Natale, M.D.,
will coordinate the efforts of a team of 15 citical
investigators at the medical school who will said
pervise the administration of the drugs. Natale, a
recently arrived faculty member from Sloan
kettering Memorial Institute in New York, will direct a special effort in the area of lung cancer.
Other medical specialists and surgeons will provide
additional support.

The trials, which will give patients a chance to
participate in voluntary treatment programs, are
the final step of a process to find new drugs for
cancer treatment by the National Cancer Institute.
