AS CAPTAIN IN 1943, Smith powered the squad to the Big Ten title and won the individual championship as well — accomplishments that earned him the office of president of the National Inter-Collegiate Golf As-

sociation.

Smith later qualified for the National Amateur three times, reaching the fourth round in 1949 and the fifth round

He qualified for the State Amateur nine times and has aced several holes. "My handicap has averaged five,"
