A 24 percent increase in sewage treatment rates, effective July 1, has been proposed for most southern Oakland and western Wayne County communities by the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD). Suburban Wayne County is expected to fight it.

The new rates include charges for an estimated \$19.5 million in repairs to a creacked Macomb County sewer which nearly collapsed a year ago.

The wholesale rate for most cities in South Oakland and western Wayne would increase from \$3.40 per 1,000 cubic feet of water to \$4.22. The increase is usually passed on to residential customers. In addition, counties and communities may add service charges.

An additional 10 cents per 1,000 cubic feet is included in the new wholesale rates for DWSD's 75 suburban community sawage treatment customers and the city of Detroit. "We see no reason why communities outside (northeastern Oakland and western Macomb counties, the areas affected by the break) should pay," said John Breen, Wayne DPW attorney. IN SOUTH OAKLAND County, the new rates will likely add at least \$10-\$13 annually to a homeowner's water bill, according to Donald Ringler of the county Department of Public Works. His estimate is based on households which use from 12,000-16,000 cubic feet of water a year for sewage. In western Wayne County, the increase could range from \$16-530 annu-ally, according to a DPW official.

The new rates, he said, will raise \$144 million for the 1981-82 fiscal year which begins July 1. The proposed increases, developed by DWSD's rate consultant, Camp, Dresser & McKee, will account for \$24.7 million in new
