## Architect to speak on Rome's buildings

"The building of cities is one of man's greatest achievements. The form of his city always has been and always will be a pitiless indicator of the state of his civilization," according to Edmund Bacon, noted author and well-known urban planner from Philadelphia.

Bacon will make the first of three special presentations at Lawrence Institute of Technology on Thursday, March 12, as part of the School of Architecture Series.

He will present "Impressions of Rome," a new look at a centuries old city, from an urban planner and designer's perspective. It begins at 7:30 p.m. in the architecture auditorium on the LIT campus, 21000 West 10 Mile Road (near Northwestern Hwy.) in Southfield.

Rome is featured in Bacon's latest book, "Design of Cities," which was acclaimed by The New Republic as the major contemporary work on urban design. The book details the monumental forces and considerations that determine the form of a great city. His study includes an in-depth discussion of several of the world's major cities with a

look at the impact of space, color, and perspective on the city-dweller.

Bacon has served as the managing director of the Philadelphia Housing Association, as well as the senior land planner and executive director of the Philadelphia City Planning Commission. His expertise was utilized by former Secretary of the Interior, Stewart Udall on his Task Force for the Potomac River Basin Plan and by former President Richard M. Nixon when he appointed Bacon a member of the Citizens Advisory Committee on Environmental Quality. Bacon also served on the Urban Transportation Advisory Council under former Secretary of Transportation, John A. Volpe.

Bacon has been the recipient of many awards including the 1976 American Institute of Architects Medal and the 1971 Distinguished Service Award of the American Institute of Planners. He is also an adjunct professor at the University of Pennsylvania and a member of the Franklin Institute. This year he will be serving as the 1981 Visiting Professor in the School of Architecture at LIT where he will be teaching urban design.
