AND MELVIN, an aspiring songwriter, teaches Hughes the lyrics to his latest endeavor, "Santa's Souped-up Sleigh." He drops the old man off in Vegas after giving him his last dollar, and that's the end of that until the millionaire's death and the discovery of the

will.

Jason Robards, foregoing some of his usual overacting, is a delight as the eccentric Hughes. He is only on the screen for 10 or 15 minutes, but what minutes they are. He is testy, bemused, assertive, peculiar, absolutely perfect as Hughes.

Melvin keeps on the move, from one city to another, one marriage to another. He is running a gas station in Utah when a mysterious stranger leaves an envelope with him and drives away. The public part of Melvin's life begins.

It involves celebrity treatment, media exposure and then derison when the will is not accepted as genuine.

Somehow, Melvin seems to handle the circumstances and disapointment. In the movie, he says he never really thought that he would get the \$156 million. The important thing was that "Howard Hughes sang my song."


