

OU cagers end season with 20 wins

Pioneers fall to Lady Titans in state final

The Oakland University women's basketball team posted its first 20-win season and finished second in the State of Michigan Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (SMIAW) at Central Michigan University last weekend.

The Pioneers, who finished the season with a 20-9 overall record, bowed to three-time state champion University of Detroit in the title game, 73-63. Oakland qualified for the finals with an upset victory over top-seeded Michigan State University and Eastern Michigan University.

"I am very proud of the way we played and never gave up," said Oakland's first-year coach Dewayne Jones. "The victory against Michigan State has to be the biggest win this year for us, and we also played well against Eastern Michigan," said Jones. "We played five excellent halves of basket-

ball in the tournament. Unfortunately, we had to play one bad half."

That one bad half was in the opening period against the Lady Titans.

Shooting only 23 percent (6-26) from the field, and 46 percent from the foul line, the Pioneers trailed 39-18 at half-time. Detroit led 19-15 when Oakland hit nearly a six-minute scoring drought, in which the Lady Titans scored 16 straight points to take a 35-15 advantage.

The Pioneers rallied in the second half and outscored Detroit 45-83. But, they were still nine points shy of Detroit.

Detroit had defeated the Pioneers 76-42 in the second game of the year. It was also the second straight year the Pioneers and Lady Titans met in the state finals.

OU sophomore Linda Krawford was the tournament's leading scorer (76 points) and leading rebounder (40). Krawford finished the year with 665

points in 29 games for a 22.9 scoring average.

Sophomore guard Anne Kish, playing her best basketball of the year, scored 42 points, grabbed 18 rebounds, dished out numerous assists and handled the opponents' pressing defenses superbly.

PIONEER SWIMMING

Oakland University's Karen Enneking is making quite a splash in her first year of collegiate swimming. And, second-year coach Pete Howland couldn't be more pleased.

Enneking has qualified for the AIAW Division I national swimming and diving championships at the University of South Carolina in Columbia, S.C., from March 19-22.

Her specialty strokes are the 50- and 100-yard breaststroke events. Enneking set school records in both events this year.

Enneking is rated 10th nationally in

the 50-yard breaststroke with a time of 31.0 in a meet against Central Michigan University. The freshman swimmer is ranked 12th nationally in the 100-yard breaststroke with a time of 1:07.0.

The Pioneers won the AIAW regional swimming and diving championships at Wright State University last weekend. Oakland defeated host Wright State and Northern Michigan University, two teams that defeated OU in regular-season dual-meets.
