

State loan aids manufacturer in Oxford

Gov. William G. Milliken has announced approval of a \$4.75-million job development loan to help an Oakland County manufacturing firm expand.

Cleason Precision Forming, Inc., will use the loan to renovate an existing building in Oxford Township and acquire new machinery and equipment. The company manufactures steel parts for the automotive, truck and machinery industries.

"The company expects to be able to hire an additional 115 workers when the expansion project is completed next year — jobs that will be most welcome," Milliken said.

The loan was approved by the Job Development Authority (JDA), an agency of the Michigan Department of Commerce.

The JDA is empowered to sell tax-exempt bonds and lend the proceeds to Michigan businesses to help finance new plants, machinery, additions to facilities or pollution control equipment. The JDA operates by taking advantage of federal regulations which allow public bodies to sell tax-exempt bonds in the private market. The bonds do not constitute a debt of Michigan taxpayers.

Good walleye outlook for '81

Look forward to some good warm weather walleye fishing this year off Michigan's lower east shore.

At least 22,000 walleyes ran up the lower Clinton River to spawn in 1980, and the state Department of Natural Resources is expecting great things for '81.

More than 1,500 adult walleyes were "tagged" last spring in the Clinton by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and state DNR biologists. DNR asks that if you catch a tagged fish, get the information to its Great Lakes station at Mt. Clemens or the district DNR office northwest of Pontiac.

The DNR's Ron Spiller, district fisheries biologist, predicts "exciting" walleye fishing from the tip of the Thumb to the Ohio border. That takes in lower Lake Huron, the St. Clair River, Lake St. Clair, the Detroit River and western Lake Erie.

Meanwhile, work is nearly complete on the Fish Point walleye rearing pond

in Turco County. This six-acre pond in the Thumb will provide thousands of fingerlings to Saginaw Bay this summer.

TIP-300 Lake, up in northwestern Oakland County's Rose Township, was "reclaimed" by DNR jargon, by having its fish stock killed off in December. In spring it will be restocked with bass, bluegills and tiger muskies, DNR says.

The Tipico project was done with ice on the lake, which DNR says will save half the cost of the chemical Rotenone as well as staff labor. Rotenone kills fish by constricting their gills and suffocating them without harming other forms of wildlife.

In the past, DNR had rated Tipico as having better than average catches of largemouth bass and northern pike, but also high in bullheads.

TWO NATURE programs are coming up at Huron-Clinton Metroparks this weekend.

"Animal Quackers — Ducks and Geese" will be a slide program followed by a two-mile walk at the nature center of Stony Creek Metropark east of Rochester. Naturalist Leslie Sutton will lead the family-oriented program starting at 9 a.m. Sunday, March 22. To register, call the nature center at 781-4621.

"Looking for Spring" is the title of a morning walk starting at 10 a.m. Sunday, March 22, at Kensington Metropark's nature center near New Hudson. Naturalist Julie Cerbus will lead the 90-minute view of emerging flowers, migrating birds and active animals. Metroparks programs are free, but there is a \$2 vehicle admission to the park. Better yet, get the \$7 bargain economy season pass.
