

# Community school launches season of variety

A variety of activities from interior design to Chinese cooking is being offered by the Ten Mile Community School during the spring term.

## Young artists named by Oakway

Oakway Symphony's third Young Artists Competition for 1981 has produced from a field of more than 34 entrants, four young musicians who have qualified for \$3,000 in prizes.

The four artists are equally divided between voice and piano with the first prize of \$1,000 going to voice student Lana Pitaseff, second and third prize of \$750 each respectively to pianist Stephanie Leon and Mark Kardel, voice, and the fourth prize of \$500 to Gong Ja Cho, voice student. Honorable mentions went to Linda Mohler, voice, and Elizabeth Lowther Lesene, piano.

Linda Pitaseff, aside from her operatic abilities, is a student of the violin and has played with the Dearborn Symphony. As a student at Eastern Michigan University, she was finalist in the Detroit Grand Opera Auditions. Presently at the University of Michigan, she studies with Eva Likova.

Pianist Stephanie Leon, winner of second place, is now in her junior year at the University of Michigan. A per-

formance major, she studies with Charles Fisher. She has appeared as soloist with the Detroit Symphony, the New Orleans Philharmonic, and recently performed with the University of Michigan Philharmonic.

Mark Kardel, third place, pianist, participated in honor student recitals in four summers spent at Interlochen Music Camp. He numbers among his teachers Flavio Varani, Wesley Fishwick, and Dady Mehta. A piano-performance student, he currently studies with Louis Nagel at the University of Michigan.

Fourth place winner, Gong Ja Cho attended Seoul National University in Seoul, Korea and was soloist with the Democratic Party Choir and Chung Myung So Sacred Choir. She was also organist with the United States Army Friendship Village Chapel. Presently a graduate student at Wayne State University, she is a student of Elsie Inselmann.

The finalists, produced by a distin-

guished panel of judges comprised of Ruth Burczyk, concert pianist and a faculty member at Interlochen, Alice Engstrom, Head of Oakland University's vocal music department, and Kenneth Jean, Assistant Conductor of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, will all appear as soloists at the Concert.

The young artist concert will occur Sunday at 3 p.m. April 5, at Madonna College (Jetties, 1-96 and Levan), at which time the awards will be presented.

Tickets are available at the door. General admission is \$5, student and senior citizens, \$2.

Immunizations for measles, German measles, mumps, polio, diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough are available.
