TODD originally appeared with the Muskegon Civic Opera Association in many musicals and sang with the Farmington Community Chorus.

"Shenandoah" is the story of a widower with six sons and a daughter who won't involve themselves in the Civil

War until one son is kidnapped by Union soldiers. The setting is Shenandoah, Va.

The show ran on Broadway for 18 months and received the Tony Award for best music in 1977.

"For Humanity's Sake" was written by Daryl Dobson for intimate theater. It tells the life and times of Mrs. Stanton who was one of the earliest founders of the Women's Movement in the U.S.

Mrs. Stanton was a close friend of Susan B. Anthony and was a co-worker with her in the effort to gain civil rights for women and other minorities. The two are often spoken of as the mothers of the feminist movement.
