

# Stellar gymnasts accomplish All-Area accolades

Temple was voted an All-American gymnast the past three years. She is being heavily recruited by a number of colleges across the country.

## JILL McBRIDE

A junior, McBride was an outstanding vaulter for Seaborn.  
McBride won the regional vaulting title with a score of 9.15. She had an exceptional day at the regional meet with a 34.70 all-around score (8.95 on bars and 8.60 on the mat).  
McBride's best effort at the state meet — where she finished among the top 20 all-around — was the vault where she scored an 8.75.

## CELESTE HARRINGTON

Harrington was Walled Lake Central's undisputed leader.

A senior transfer student, this was Harrington's first and last season with the Vikings.

Harrington finished seventh all-around at the state meet with a 34.70. Her best state effort was on the vault where she finished second with a 9.25. She was eighth in floor exercises and tenth on the balance beam.

At the Freeland Regional, Harrington won the bar and beam to finish first all-around with a 35.50.

"Celeste was great to have on the team, even if it was only for a year," said Central coach Denise Kim. "She helped other teammates all the time, and was a great inspiration to us all."

Harrington will attend the University of Utah on a gymnastics scholarship.

## KATHY MICHAELS

Kathy Michaels is only a sophomore, but she's already attained All-American status in vault, beam and floor exercises.

Michaels was sixth all-around at the state meet, where her best performance was on the balance beam (8.75). She was first all-around at the Southeastern Michigan Association meet.

"Kathy has a lot of drive and determination," said Troy coach Sandy Smith. "She decides what she wants to learn then goes after it."

## LISA BOES

Lisa Boes, an All-American in floor exercises, has been a four-year member of the Troy team. During her career she has won six times in 52 dual-meets.  
"She (Boes) was our team captain,

and she progressed a great deal during her four years (at Troy)," said Smith.

Boes had an excellent floor routine at the state meet and finished second in that event with a 9.00. She was ninth all-around.

Boes holds the floor exercise record at Troy (9.10 last year). Boes finished first in floor exercises at the regional.

NORTH FARMINGTON'S Mary Johnesse and Troy's Sandy Smith were selected as Coaches of the Year.

Johnesse's had an All-American team as proclaimed by the National High School Gymnastics Coaches Association. Troy's Sandy Smith was picked as coach of the year by Michigan state gymnastics coaches.

The OGE all-area second-team includes Seaborn sophomore Jenny Matz on vault, Andover senior Christy Schwartz on bars, North Farmington freshman Dona Kebride on beam and Andover senior Missy Otterbein on floor exercises.
