

Red Cross seeking teens for summer

Summer-placement interviews for young people between 14 and 17 who are interested in volunteering with the American Red Cross are now being scheduled at two locations in Oakland County.

Young people can gain valuable work experience and explore career possibilities in a variety of areas through volunteer service. Red Cross youth volunteers work in hospitals, nursing homes, at Red Cross offices and blood-donor centers, and in summer reading and handicapped recreation programs.

Architect to speak on urban planning

Edmund Bacon, author, architect, and urban planner, will present the second in his three-part Architecture series at Lawrence Institute of Technology on Thursday, April 9 at 7:30 p.m.

Bacon will be presenting a visual presentation entitled "The American Urban Experience," detailing the past, present and future of the country's cities and urban culture.
