THE LAST FEW decades have seen major changes in views about birthing and early nurturing, the pediatrician, now 78, told his audience of natural childbirth advocates. He mentioned particularly the use of drugs for mothers in labor and forceps in the birth process, the hospital stays of 12 days and the hospital policies discouraging breastfeeding.

"It is a good example of how medicine gets off on the wrong track for years and years before someone has the sense to question it," Spock said.

That situation, he said, led to the first edition of his famous book, be-cause he and other pediatricians tended to receive an enormous number of calls from new mothers in their first weeks at home.
