

Focus of 3-day conference: reducing on-the-job stress

In a departure from usual programming practices, the Society of Manufacturing Engineers, a 50,000-member international engineering society, will feature Southfield hypnotherapist Barry Beder in a one-day "Managing Stress" symposium at its 1981 International Tool and Manufacturing Engineering Conference and Exposition at Cobo Hall in Detroit Monday through Wednesday.

Beder became a nationally recognized hypnotherapist when he designed and implemented the only stress management program accepted and used by the Professional Air Traffic Controllers Organization at Chicago Center and Detroit Metro Airport.

SINCE THEN, Beder has conducted stress, smoking, and weight loss programs for various local and national organizations, including Michigan Bell, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Eastern Michigan University, and Multiple Sclerosis Society.

He also regularly conducts stop smoking clinics for the American Lung Association of Michigan around the entire state.

According to Tom Heath, SME's Manager of Technical Activities and the one initially responsible for involving Beder in SME's national workshops, offering the stress program at a tool and manufacturing exposition is not really unusual.

Beder designed this program so manufacturing managers can learn an immediate, hands-on technique to stress reduction that will teach them to control and reduce the harmful effects of stress (hypertension, headaches, insomnia, increased risk of heart disease).

"Hypnosis will have an enormous impact on education and training in the '80s. We'll look back on it as the most dynamic learning tool of the decade," said Beder.

God will judge space-shuttle 'folly'

Since ancient times, religious leaders have spoken of God's judgment. This is because God in the Jewish-Christian tradition is seen as just. He is one who does not allow evil and chaos to continue. The judgment which is envisioned in scripture is not so much an individual thing. The focus of God's justice is most striking in regard to nations. The prophets saw Israel as a nation which would experience destruction because it had failed to seek the will of God. Jeremiah predicted such a time of ruin in the 6th century B.C. because the people had failed to be true to their agreement with God.

In modern times, the church in eastern Europe has echoed this thought. The judgment of God upon the immorality of the church and the society has been to allow the rise of communism.

A church which was dominated by the rich nobility had lost touch with human need. A harsh political system changed those conditions of poverty, which the church with its privilege had failed to address.

WHAT IS GOD'S judgment in our day? Some

religious leaders would predict the final holocaust and the end of the world. For them, God's judgment will be the saving of the few and the damning of the many.

More realistically, God's judgment continues in the process of history. We cannot do evil and escape its consequences. As a nation, our increasingly larger commitments to an arms race proceeds counter to God's will. Human need and dislocation becomes greater and the rich nations carry on an ever more demanding arms production.

This nation cannot pour an ever-increasing amount of its resources into war preparations. This nation cannot ignore God's will for peace and brotherhood. The judgment is and will continue to be economic ruin for those who pursue the arms of the nations.

When the economic reversal falls, it will be no surprise to the person steeped in scripture. God strikes people in their most sensitive spot. For this nation it is our pocketbook.

THE SPACE SHUTTLE is a good example of

our folly. Billed as a peaceful exploration of space, it will become increasingly a military vehicle.

The budget is now one-third military. This will increase to a majority of military application as the space funds are cut. The major concern of this space system is to "keep up with the Russians" in developing a capacity for war in space.

Will God fail to judge such waste? Will God fail to provide conditions by which we will be forced to painfully reverse this folly?

The prophet Jeremiah saw hope after tragedy. He saw a rebuilding of his nation after the nightmare of destruction. So the religious person has a strange mixture of feelings as he observes the economic results of the Vietnam War and continued military spending.

God's judgment is necessary and good to correct evil. So the correction must continue. Like some small child who has gone astray, our nation must be forced to acknowledge its excesses.
