## High taxes erode property rights, Realtors say

The right to own private property gradually is being croded away by ercessive government spending and high riaxes, according to Heiga M. Nisonger, president of the Birmingham-Bloomfield Board of Realtors.

"Government rights, such as the power to tax, in many cases have made homes unaffordable," she said.

Nisonger made her comments during the kickoff to Private Property Week which began Sunday.

"Excessive government spending, which is chiefly responsible for high interest rates, makes such goals a pipe dream for many young people."

Nisonger urged all American adults, including the 55 percent who already

own property, to remember they have the right to own property. "Only by knowing our rights, and ex-ercising the right to protect them, will we be able to protect our free en-terprise system as well as our political independence," she said.

As they fill out annual federal and state income tax forms, people realize what a large share of their income goes to various levels of government," Shimmin said.

He added that the need for certain government control of property cannot be denied, but excessive use of regulations increasingly are becoming destructive of owner rights.

"Recent studies have shown that repeal of unnecessary government re-strictions could lower home building costs as much as 20-30 percent," he

Bellemead of Michigan will break ground April 20 for its first building at the Northfield Hills Corporate Center. The three-story office building will lead the 1-31-8 buildings uill mately planned for the 300-acre site north of 5800 New King Street just off the 1-75 exit ramp, will be built on an eight-acre site. It will feature an artium and extensively landscaped grounds. Completion is planned for Pebruary 1982. Buildings eventually will cover about 161 acres and offer two million square feet of office space. One of the largest developers of sub-urban office parks in eastern United States, Bellemead was founded in 1923. Since 1970, it has been a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Obb Corp., an insur-ance company with a net worth of ap-proximately \$2.5 million.
