### Walk for mankind slated

Attention, Dr. Scholl: On Saturday, May 16, and Saturday, June 6, more than 15,000 metro Detroiters will par-ticipate in the annual Walk for Man-kind.

Walkers will take a 30-kilometer stroll in one of 15 area communities to assist the patients of Project Concern, an international, non-profit beath care and training organization which serves impovershed people in the United States and other countries.

Walks will be held on May 16 in Can-ton, Dearborn, Flat Rock, Pinckney, Walker and Yallon, Technon, Troy, Waterford, Westland, Woodhaven, Kyandotte and Vygalanti Livonia and Northville Walks will be held on June 6. Each walk is ponsored by the local Jaycee and Jaycette chapters. According to Joyes Julius, Project Concern regional director, the majority of the funds raised will go to support Project Concern's clinics and training programs. Approximately 29 percent of the funds will be returned to local projects or organizations.

"Walkers are belping the patients of Project Concern through the donations of their sponsors. In our field programs, it costs only 45 cents to infundate a child against deptheria and telanus. For 31, four children can be immunized against cholera; four lives saved. For 36, three children saffering from, typhold, it means the difference between life and death. And 350 will train a local resident in a program area to become a health premoter. It's a chance for people to help themselves and their neighbors towards better health. Being involved as either a walker or a sponsor means saving lives and that's really being a hero."

Project Concern was founded in 1981 and maintains clinics 'in Hong Kong, Mexico, Ball, Guatemain, he Gambia, Bolivia, North Sulawasi and in the United States serving the people of Appalachia and the Navajo Indians in New Mexico.
