

# Harrison boys outrun Northville

Senior Ken Kopko won three individual events and anchored a winning relay to pace Farmington Harrison's 76-56 win over Northville in the Western Six League. Harrison is 4-1 overall. Kopko won the 400 dash (53.9), the 800 dash (24.0), and the discus (129 feet, 5 inches). The winning 800 relay consisted of Steve Sweeney, Brian Sandler, Flen Baker and Kopko. Steve Sweeney of Harrison won the long jump (19-5½) and the high jump (6-0), and teammate Mike Boyd won

the high hurdles (16.7) and the low hurdles (43.2). Sweeney was first in the 100 dash (11.5), and Ed Mohr won the pole vaulting competition at 12-0. Northville's Scott Dayton won the mile (4:40.0) and the two-mile (10:14.0). Northville has a 4 p.m. meet on Wednesday at Plymouth Canton.

wasn't enough as his Farmington teammates lost a 69-53 Inter Lakes League track meet to Milford Lakeland Thursday afternoon. Kielly won the long jump (21-feet), high jump (6-feet-4), discus (139-0) and the low hurdles (39.7). Pete Brown and Steve Boykin were also winners for Farmington. The winning 440-yard relay team consisted of Mike Ryan, Chris Golla, Jeff Beard and Kevin Davis. Farmington, now 5-2 overall and 3-1
