Road Group Wants Voter Registration In Area Centers

The Farmington Township Road Association has asked the township clerk to set up registration facilities in stores, neighborhood shopping centers, and schools for signing up voters for the November general election.

In a letter to Township Clerk Floyd Cairns, the Association stated: "We feel the township area is so large it is most inconvenient for many people to come to the township hall alone. Detroit has such a system for voter registration, and since there is such apathy in the township we feel that it is necessary for our officials to make this gesture."

Cairns told The Enterprise Observer that instead of conducting registration points throughout the township it is far more feasible to operate from the township hall.

To make it easier for voters to register, Cairns explained, his office will remain open till 8 p.m. Sept. 1-4. He said the late hours provide ample opportunity for voters to register if they so desire.

Cairns explained his office did not have sufficient personnel to spread over the township during life weeks preceding an election. Instead, it was better to keep his staff in one spot to better serve voters, Cairns added.

In the past, Cairns said he set up a registration point at North Farmington High School last year criticized because it supposedly benefited the Re-
