The church, at 20300 Middle Belt, Livonia, will welcome Dr. Rees to its pulpit for services at 8:45 and 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Sunday, May 17, and has scheduled four teaching meetings in the next three days.

The theme for Dr. Rees messages will be the Holy Spirit, and he will examine it in terms of Christian identity, solidarity, ministry and adequacy.

His talks after Sunday will be given for a breakfast meeting for ministers and Christian leaders at 7:30 a.m. Tuesday and at 7:30 p.m. Monday through Wednesday.

Dr. Rees has visited more than 60 countries as preacher and Bible teacher. He has been president of the National Association of Evangelicals, minister to ministers in the Billy Graham organization, vice-president at large for World Vision International and a member of the board of directors for Bread for the World.

He now serves on the National Association of Evangelicals board of admin-
