Two of their children now work with the company, Jerry Wingerter is operations manager of all stores, directing both daily operations as well as all seasonal floor layout revisions. Daughter Judy is the general office manager and director of display.

The Wingerters find it hard to be-lieve that the business is 20 years old but do believe that some of their origi-nal customers, who still shop in the Farmington store, will be in for a surprise when they hear of the anniver-sary.


