Navy airman Patrick Louis of Garden City told his mother that his job aboard an aircraft carrier was so dargerous that it was 'almost suicidal.'
Louis made the statement in a letter received by his mother one day after she found out that her son was one of 14 servicemen killed in a crash on the USS Nimitz.

Louis, 21, was killed when a Navy jet, attempting a night landing, crashed into other planes on the deck of the aircraft carrier. The accident aboard the nuclear-powered carrier came during a trainpometed carrier came during a traing mission in the Atlantic, 60 miles east of Jacksonville, Fia. Louis, who attended Garden City West High School until 1978, was one of

In his letter, dated just two days before he was killed, Louis described the dangers of his job and 12-hour shifts.

At one point, he was "nearly blown off" the carrier deck by the exhaust from a jet plane.

"The noise is so loud, it makes your whole body shake," he wrote his mother.


