BRADD MORSE — Troy's Morse, a second-place performer at the Class A state meet in discus, finished with the area's best discus throw — 172-11.

Only a junior, Morse was the SMA champion and a regional champion. He placed third at the county meet.

CRAIG KELTY — Farmington's Kiely is one of the most versatile athletes on the squad, although he gains honors as the top high jumper in the area. Kielty thed Gary Burns of Bingham Brother Rice with the areas top high jump of 6-8. Kielty, however, jumped a 6-8 at the state meet to place third in this event. FREEMAN DONLOE — Southfield's Donloo, a senior, had big shoes to fill this year, replacing All-Stater Vincent Bean in the long jump. And be admirably responded with a second-place finlsh in this event at state. Donloo's best jump this season was 23-3. He placed second in the regional and county meets and was the SMA champion. He also ran one leg of Southfield's first-team 440-yard relay.
