MARK SHAW — Shaw joins West Bloomfield teammate Dan Kewell on this honor team as the area's top miller. Shaw, a senior, who finished second in the mile listings to Bloomfield Hills

Cranbrook's Tim Cannon, won the county meet and the O&E meet. He placed third in the regionals and seventh at the state meet.

TIM CANNON — Cannon, consid-

ered by many as the premier distance runner in the county, led the area in both the mile (4:13.8) and two-mile (9:09.0) events. He is honored as the area's top two miller. Cannon, a senior, also was a member of the O&E All-

RELAY TEAMS

440-YARD RELAY — Southfield High earned first-team honors with a time of 44.0 seconds — best in the area. Terrance Robinson, Mark Harris, Freeman Donloe and Reggie Hayes combined for this time, finishing first in the SMA league meet, third at the regional and ninth at the Class A state meet.

800-YARD RELAY — Detroit Country Day's foursome of Geoffrey Craig, Troy Hudson, David Cavotti and Damon Jones combined for the area's fastest time in this relay — 1:31.5. This relay was second at the Metro Conference league meet, second at the regional and fifth in the Class C state meet.

MILE RELAY — Avondale and Troy share first-team honors in this event. Troy had the fastest time of the two foursomes (3:26.3) thanks to Doug Plau, Jack Johansson, Rob McAdow and Larry Wells. This group combined to win the SMA league title and place third at the regionals.

Avondale's foursome included seniors Ken Delmon, Chuck Snyder, and Joe Sadler and junior Mark Priest. Avondale's best time of the season was 3:27.4. The group placed third in the North Oakland Activities Conference (NOAC) meet, second at the regional and sixth at the county meet.

Lahser's Rolston will call it quits

Don Rolston, the only boys track and boys' cross country coach at Bloomfield Hills Lahser, retired from coaching yesterday after 20 years of service — the last 14 at Lahser.

For his outstanding contribution to boys' track and boys' cross country in this area, the Observer & Eccentric gives special recognition to this dedicated coach and teacher.

Rolston, a 1951 graduate of Central Michigan University, began his coaching career at Mayville in the thumb area.

After six years at Mayville, Rolston came to Bloomfield Hills in the fall of 1967 to initiate the track and cross country programs for newly built Lahser High School.

Rolston, one of the most respected coaches in the area, drew high praise each year from fellow colleagues for his work with the annual Lahser Relays — one of the top meets each season.

Horse show coming up

The 41-year-old Detroit Horse Show will be the next major attraction of the 1981 Bloomfield Open Hunt Club.

The Detroit Horse Show, which was first held in 1935, will begin tomorrow and run through Sunday.

More than 600 horses from 22 states are expected to compete at the annual extravaganza. Riders range in experience from international champions to teen-age beginners.

Most of the riders are aiming towards the 1984 United States Olympic team.

The highlight of the week will be on Friday when the \$20,000 North American Grand Prix will be contested. In that event some of the world's finest riders and their mounts will have to contend with 16 barriers measuring up to 5 feet 6 inches in height.
