It will be easier next year to get to the Proud Lake State Recreation Area north of Wixom.

The Oakland County Road Commis-The Oakland County Road Commission let a contract for relocation and paying of Glengary Road between Wigom and Benstein roads, an important east-west access route to the popular camping, canceing and fishing area.
