Members of New Morning School, a parent-cooperative for children in preschool through eighth grade, will host an informational meeting about the school at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, July 8.

The meeting will be held in the Livonia home of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Schult, who are the parents of Elaine Yagiela, founder and teacher of New Morning. Persons wishing to attend the

discussion and slide presentation are invited to call 349-9294.

The school was founded in Plymouth in 1973, then moved to Dearborn Heights while seeking a permanent location in the Plymouth area. Plans now are for a September opening on a three-acre site in Plymouth Township.

New Morning School encourages family participation both in and out of the classroom. Parents serve as members of the board, on the curriculum committee, as teachers' aides and janitors.

"New Morning School's non-graded individualized program is designed to meet the needs of a wide range of children," Ms. Yagiela said. "We keep a low faculty-child ratio and use a variety of teaching approaches to create and maintain each child's interest in learning."

The school expanded to offer a preschool and day care program last January with several options for working parents.

Marilyn Romack of Canton Township directs the preschool sessions and will be available to answer questions at the informational meeting.

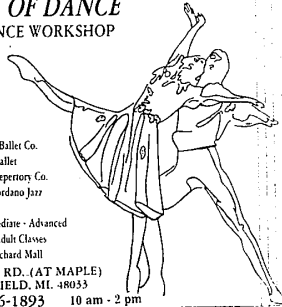
