Farmington Community Center's chamber music series, "Intermezzo," continues at 7 p.m. Sunday, July 19. The program, to be held in the living room of the center, will feature Patricia Terry on harp and Marilyn Jones on flute.

Ms. Terry is harp, piano, and vocal instructor at Cass Tech High School as well as an adjunct professor of harp at Wayne State University.

She is principal harpist with the Dearborn and Oak Park Symphonies, Michigan Chamber Orchestra and Michigan Opera Theatre.

She has performed with the Detroit Symphony on numerous occasions, including its 1980 tour to Carnegie Hall and the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., and as harp soloist for its 1981 School Concert Series. She received both her bachelor and master music degrees from University of Michigan.

MARILYN JONES has her Ph.D. in music from the University of Michigan and is vocal and instrumental instructor at Renaissance High School in Detroit.

She is also director of Schoolcraft College Community Choir. She was principal flutist with Michigan Chamber Orchestra and has played with the Detroit Symphony and in numerous

chamber music recitals.

The program will open with Pachelbel's "Sonata in C Minor," an 18th century keyboard piece transcribed for harp and flute. Other selections will include contemporary music by Carlos Salzedo, whose intricate compositions highlight the special effects of the harp.

Tickets are \$4 per person or \$3 for students and senior citizens. A reception for the artists follows the concert.
