

# Area athletes psyched up for Cerebral Palsy Games

When upwards of 500 athletes gather in Kingston, R.I., this week to compete in the national Cerebral Palsy Games, Kent Anderson, Steven Dell and David Marcy will be there.

The three Livonia residents will participate in their own sports festival and will also enjoy the company of other athletes from around the country when not on the field, in the pool or in the gymnasium.

This is the second year for the national games, and, for the first time, athletes had to meet qualifying standards in order to take part. The standards depend on the mobility of the athlete.

Cerebral palsy is a paralysis that results from developmental defects in the brain or injury at birth.

Anderson, 22, will be competing in discus, softball throw and table tennis.

Dell, 13, has qualified for the 25-meter backstroke and the 25-meter freestyle.

Marcy, 14, will enter the 60-meter dash and shot put.

All three are wheelchair athletes. Dell, the most severely handicapped, is categorized as Class 1. Anderson is Class 3, Marcy Class 4. The higher the class, the more stringent the qualifying standards.

A VETERAN of the national games in Detroit two years ago, Anderson is angling for a berth in the international games next year in Denmark.

To make the trip, Anderson will have to impress in Kingston.

He's been working with Mike Mushett and the Tri-City Seals, an offshoot of the Tri-City Therapeutic recreation program, and with the track team at Central Michigan University.

"I've been training for these national games since the last national games," Anderson said. "At school (CMU), I worked out with the weightmen. Dave Kieley, a Churchill grad who now lives in Farmington, helped me out a lot."

"Matt Edinger, who throws the hammer and shot, helped me out on speed a lot," Anderson added.

Anderson said CMU track coach Dan Saxima encouraged him to work with the team. There was some awkwardness the first couple of weeks considering Anderson's physical limitations, but that all went by the boards as time went on.

Anderson qualified in discus with a throw of 38-6 (the qualifying standard is 17-6). He threw the softball 46-2 1/2 without a warmup to easily meet the qualifying standard of 32 feet.

Anderson has learned to make the most of his physical abilities in throwing the discus. Such phrases as "degree of mobility" and "range of motion" crop up in the conversation when he talks about his style. Mushett says that Anderson has a good chance of earning one of the 50 positions on the U.S. team for the International Games.

"He's an excellent athlete, an experienced athlete," Mushett said. "He trains hard."

Dell, whose insight into sports is impressive for a 13-year-old, is a swimmer who qualified for the nationals with a clocking of 2:43 in the 25-meter freestyle and 1:43 in the 25-meter backstroke.

The qualifying standards were 3:25 for each event.

Because of severe spasticity, Dell has to work hard to succeed. He wears a lifelike while he is in the water.
