Auction benefits victim's family

Unitarian Singles of Metropolitan Detroit is soliciting donations for an educational trust fund for the three teenage daughters of Gloria Rose Allen, 38. Ms. Allen died Aug. 10 after being stabbed in the parking lot of the Sandy Corporation Building on Northland Drive.

A 17-year-old Detroit youth has been charged with first degree murder in the case. He is being held without bond while awaiting a court examination on Aug. 24.

To help raise funds for the education

al trust, the Unitarian Singles will sponsor a public auction at 7:30 p.m. Oct. 24 at Northwest Unitarian Universalist Church, 23925 Northwestern Highway.

Both goods and services are needed to make the auction a success, according to Faye Dukes, who is co-chairing the fund along with Gloria Lord.

"We feel that practically anything of value will be of great benefit to the children's educational fund," said Ms. Dukes. "The money derived from the auction will be placed in a special bank

account in trust for the Allen girls to complete their schooling."

SHE SAID that items that could be donated include dinner for two, theater tickets, art works and services such as several hours of free work by a carpenter. A professional auctioneer has donated his services for the event.

Ms. Lord said that Mrs. Allen left little insurance money since she had recently changed jobs. Her three daughters, ages 15, 16 and 17, hope to attend college after graduating from high school.

To contribute money, goods or a service to the fund, write a brief note describing the item, its minimum value, your name, address and phone number. Mail the information to the Gloria Allen Memorial Fund, 23551 Morton, Oak Park 48237.

An admission charge of \$4 for group members and \$5 for non members will be charged for the auction to defray the cost of refreshments.

A former resident of Oak Park and Westland, Mrs. Allen and two of her daughters had moved to Inster last spring to care for her parents.

Mrs. Allen was active in Northwest Unitarian Universalist Church in Southfield.

She also was immediate past vice-president of Unitarian Singles, a 700-member social organization which is sponsoring the auction.

The group raised \$400 for the fund last Friday at one of its regularly scheduled functions, according to Gene Yarnell, director of information for the fund committee. Estelle Wolok handles all planning for the fund committee.

Perry's buys Arnold's

Perry Drugs has bought the Arnold's Drug Store on 12 Mile and Farmington roads along with ten other Arnold's outlets.

Last September Arnold's employees went on strike after their contract ran out leaving them without medical, dental or optical insurance.

Borman's Inc., which owned Arnold's, also asked for a two-year wage freeze for all Arnold's employees, which contributed to the walk-out of 300 Arnold's employees statewide.

The sale of the Arnold's store was

not connected to the strike, says Robert T. Markwart, Borman's vice-president of public relations.

"Our long term outlook indicated it was a lack of profitability for the Arnold's division to continue," he says. "Borman's made no provision for the Arnold's employees to be hired by the Perry's, and Perry's did not provide for the hiring of the Arnold's personnel."

"We simply obtained the location," says Bernie Tombs, director of public relations for Perry's.

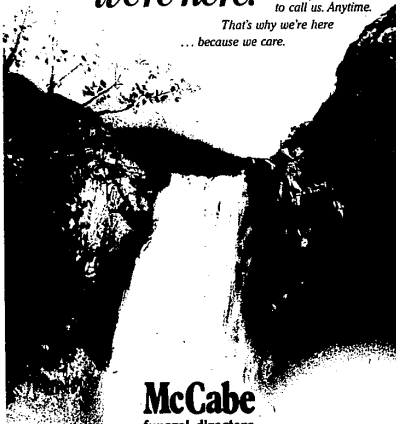
